Blue-tailed Damselfly Ischnura elegans

> Abundant

Hairy Dragonfly Brachytron pratense

➤ First observed on 10.05.1999 (MW)

Migrant Hawker Aeshna mixta

> Observed annually, abundant, throughout the reserve and peaking sometimes into three figures and present into November in some years

Southern Hawker Aeshna cyanea

➤ Observed annually, frequent, especially by the northern plantation and bridleway hedges

Brown Hawker Aeshna grandis

> Scarce

Emperor Dragonfly Anax Imperator

➤ Observed annually, common, especially over the reservoir and open water areas 0f the reedbed and dykes

Four-spotted Chaser Libellula quadrimaculata

➤ First observed on 25.05.2006 (MW)



Broad-bodied Chaser Libellula depressa

First observed on 07.06.2000 (MW), 15 on 05.06.2001. This species is now well established on the reserve.

Black-tailed Skimmer Orthetrum cancellatum

➤ Observed annually, abundant in some years especially by the muddy margins of all the wetland areas. Especially abundant along the borrow dyke, internal watercourses and the boardwalk.

Common Darter Sympetrum striolatum

➤ Abundant

Ruddy Darter Sympetrum sanguineum

➤ Abundant
