Welcome to our nature reserves

Suffolk Wildlife Trust nature reserves are special sites for wildlife. Our aim is to protect them and to ensure visitors have the chance to experience the very best of Suffolk's nature. This guide can help you make the most of your visit to a nature reserve when bringing a dog to minimise disturbance to wildlife.

Where dogs are allowed on Suffolk Wildlife Trust nature reserves, they must be kept on leads.

Check suffolkwildlifetrust.org/dogs and the map opposite to find out where dogs can be walked on leads.

WHY WE ASK YOU TO KEEP DOGS ON LEADS

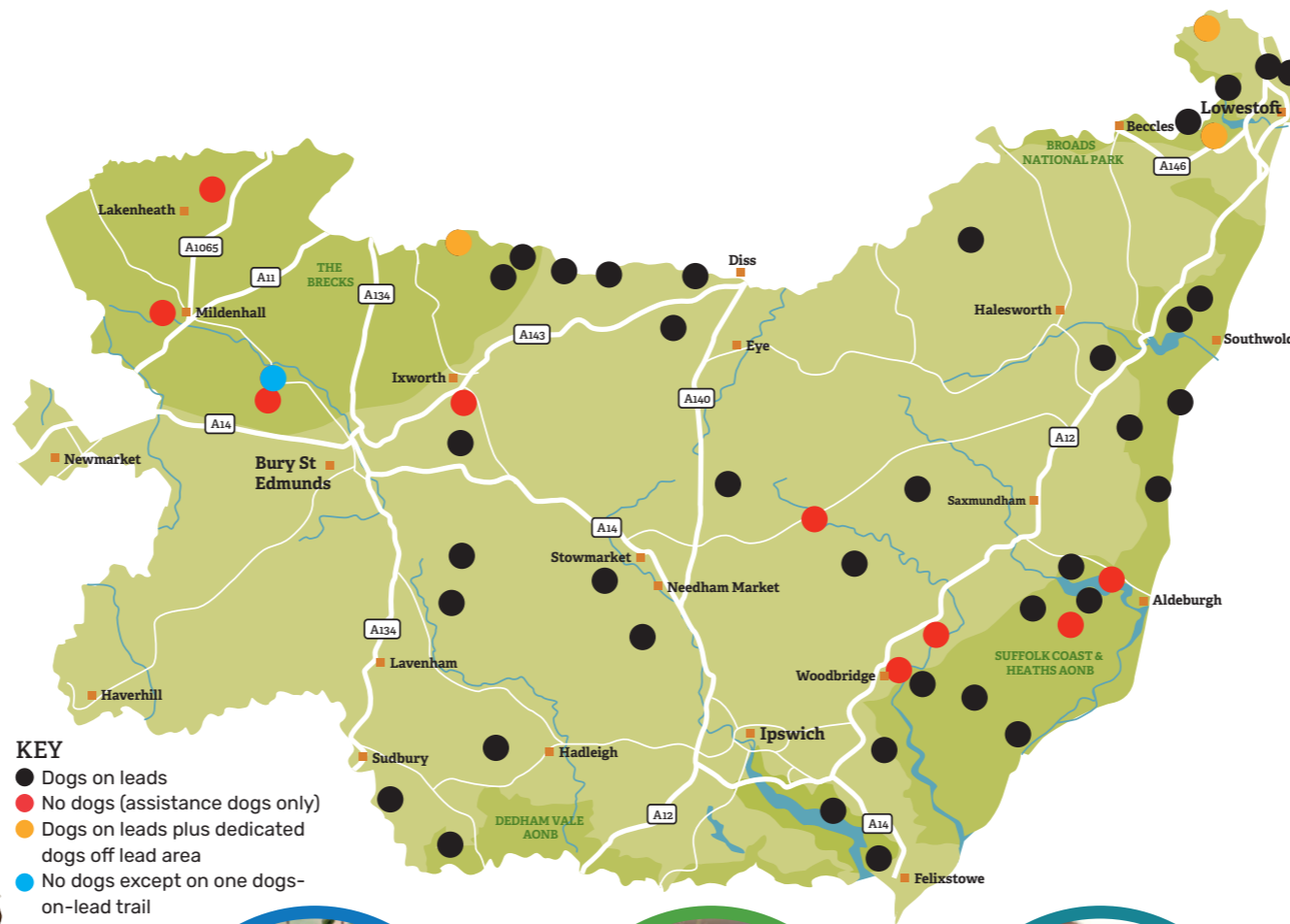
- Minimises disturbance to wildlife (birds, mammals, insects, amphibians and reptiles) which has very little space remaining in the UK.
- Reduces risks to other animals and people, and shows consistency of behaviour to other dog owners.
- Lessens the impact of dog poo and wee on plants and wildlife.
- Ensures dogs are kept out of water. The impact of dog medication such as flea treatments can be very toxic for wildlife.

WHY WE ALLOW VISITORS WITH DOGS

Our nature reserves are central to our charitable objectives to create opportunities for everyone to connect with nature and enjoy wildlife.

Responsible dog walking will, where it is within the Trust's control, be managed to limit negative impacts on wildlife and encourage quiet enjoyment of these special places.

Except for a handful of nature reserves where exceptional conditions apply, most Suffolk Wildlife Trust nature reserves allow visitors with dogs on leads.



Not all of our nature reserves have bins, so please take any dog waste home with you to dispose of responsibly. For specific dog facilities, please check our individual reserve web pages.



Assistance dogs are allowed on all of our reserves. For the safety and comfort of all visitors, volunteers and staff, dogs are not allowed in our visitor centres, other than assistance dogs.
