

Trees KS2- How to guide

Collect equipment from the centre and follow the map to Community Wood.

Equipment

You will need to bring:

- clipboards and pencils
- printed 'Tree Study' sheet for pupils to complete

Equipment below is provided

- Leaf key trail
- Laminated leaves (unlabelled) x 11
- Making leaf keys sheets with wipeable pens
- Clinometers x 10
- Tape measures x 10
- Calculators x 10
- Identification sheets/books
- Build a Tree resource sheet

Instructions

1. Leaf Key Trail: split the pupils into small groups (pairs or threes), give each group a laminated leaf. Discuss how dichotomous keys work and ask them to follow the trail to identify the leaf they are holding.

Discuss: was there any terminology they were unfamiliar with, e.g. 'lobed' 'leaflet', what do these mean?

Sort the leaves into deciduous and evergreen species and discuss features of each.

- 2. Making Leaf Keys: ask pupils to select 3 different leaves in their groups and write a key to identify them. What questions do they need to ask? What are the similarities, differences and defining features?
- 3. Tree Study: each group will need a clipboard, pencil, Tree Study sheet, clinometer and tape measure and calculator to work out the height, girth and age of a tree.
 - Discuss: what ages did each group make the trees? Community Wood was planted for the Millennium (2000). How variable were the results?
- 4. Build a tree: using the whole group, build a working model of a tree to demonstrate how water and food moves throughout a tree. See separate 'Build a Tree' resource sheet.

At the end of the activity

- 1. Wipe down 'Making Leaf Keys' sheets
- 2. Check and return all equipment to the box and return it to the centre.
