Suffolk Wildlife Trust is an inspiring and impactful organisation with a compelling vision for our county:

A wilder Suffolk where nature is thriving and abundant, because everyone is doing more to help.

Every member of the team has a direct role to play in our mission to **Bring nature back.**

In the decade to 2030 we are committed to scaling up our activities across the county to bring nature back to Suffolk.

Our aim is for 30% of our county to be connected and well looked after for nature by 2030, so that our species and habitats can recover and thrive - and for 1 in 4 people to be actively helping to achieve this.



About this opportunity

Suffolk Wildlife Trust has secured grant support from The National Lottery Heritage Fund for an exciting 3 year initiative along the lower Waveney Valley within the Broads National Park.

For nature, the land purchase and habitat creation will:

- Establish a significant new nature reserve
- Champion nature recovery within the southern Broads National Park, creating connectivity to other high value and protected sites along the valley.
- Actively engage with farmers, landowners and community groups to support them to improve the management of their land for wildlife including for species like lapwing and Norfolk hawker.
- Raise water levels on the peat soils, reducing the risk of oxidation and loss of carbon to the atmosphere.
- Develop a landscape recovery vision for the length of the Waveney
 from the Brecks to the Broads.



About this opportunity

The initiative includes three new roles to deliver our ambition for wildlife and people, from Beccles to Lowestoft.


For people who live, visit or work here, the project will:

- Be for everyone, with the inclusive 'outreach' approach taking the project into the local community to reach people who might not see nature or a nature reserve as relevant to them.
- Foster nature connection and the wellbeing benefits this brings with community groups and at community venues along the Waveney valley, from Lowestoft to Beccles.
- Enable nature connection to grow into nature action, with activities, training courses and support networks for all.
- Champion a community organising approach with individuals, community groups and businesses, to help improve the management of gardens and community spaces for wildlife including for declining species like swift and amphibians.
- Create opportunities for volunteering across the network of Trust nature reserves and within their community.



About this opportunity

This new role is one of three created to deliver our ambition for wildlife and people. You will based at Carlton Marshes, which is the office, and visitor hub for our activity in NE Suffolk. There will be some flexibility to work at SWT head office, Brooke House in Ashbocking.



Role description – what you will do

Every staff role has three key areas of focus to support our mission to bring nature back. Typically, you will spend 80% of your time on these:

1. Provide expert wildlife advice to Farmers and Land Managers

- •Provide expert wildlife advice to farmers and land managers across the lower Waveney Valley and North Suffolk
- •Work with farmers and landowners, inspiring them to take action to help Suffolk's wildlife either through existing or recommended management or via wilding approaches. Providing informal habitat management advice through site visits, reports and signposting to further reading/events.
- •Setting up, developing, and supporting farmer and landowner clusters, encouraging long-term self-reliance.
- •Consider setting up volunteer groups, alongside Senior Farm Adviser to monitor SWT priority species to enable us to measure the success of our work across the county.
- •Develop expertise in specialist areas of farming, farm wildlife or wider ecology to the direct benefit of your work and to strengthen the team overall.
- •Reporting successes internally to managers, members.



Role description continued...

- 2. Identify and deliver funded projects on habitat enhancement and creation that deliver strategic objectives. Including agri-environment schemes, other government grants, BNG and private investment opportunities.
- Delivering investment in biodiversity on farmland to support our priority species and habitats, at the direction of the Senior Farm Adviser.
- Working strategically with other team members and across the Trust to coordinate our farmland advisory project work.
- Provide detailed agri-environment scheme advice, from scoping, application completion and delivery advice.
- Keep up to date with external funding opportunities, requirements via partnership working with NGOs and business.
- 3. Expand influence on wildlife friendly farming to a wider audience of landowners, farmers, stakeholders and public across Suffolk
- Deliver a range of networking and training events for Farmers and Land Managers in the lower Waveney Valley and north Suffolk to harness interest and action
- Reporting successes externally to the wider public through events, articles, social media and meetings.
- Represent the Trust at external stakeholder meetings.
- Be an ambassador for Suffolk Wildlife Trust.
