What is Wilder Schools?

Wilder Schools is a new approach to working with schools.

Our Wilder Schools approach

We work with schools in three ways:

Engagement Officer-led visits to our learning reserves and centres

Schools choose 3 x one hour sessions to build a full day of outdoor learning led by our experienced Engagement Officers at one of our learning reserves or centres

Self-led visits to our learning reserves and centres

Schools book a self-led visit to one of our learning reserves or centres, download resources, collect equipment and use our stunning sites to bring outdoor learning to life

Team Wilder Schools

Staff and children in Team Wilder schools are working with our Engagement Officers on longer term projects to embed nature in the curriculum and take action for nature and climate in the school grounds.



Team Wilder Schools

A project-based approach Focusing on key priority areas in the county, we are working with schools to bring about nature's recovery.

How it works

In each Team Wilder school, we work with staff and children to identify how their school grounds can become a better space for nature, as well as how best to support them integrating nature and outdoor spaces into their school ethos and everyday life.

This can happen in a variety of ways, usually starting with a whole-school assembly and a staff meeting. After this, each step is tailored to the individual school's journey, including creating an action plan with staff and children, undertaking baseline surveys of the school grounds with children, facilitating outdoor learning sessions with children, delivering training to staff, providing advice and support on organising a fundraising event and enabling school grounds improvement projects ranging from leaving wild patches to creating a wildlife gardens. Every Team Wilder school is different!



Team Wilder Schools

Year 1 – An example programme

Work with one year group (usually Year 4 or above) three days per term.

The school commits to one member of staff undertaking accredited training e.g. Leader in Outdoor Learning (Level 2) and up to twelve staff participating in a one day CPD.

Term 1 – Discovery and Planning

Day 1: Habitats and baseline

Attend a staff meeting to introduce staff to the benefits of outdoor learning Team Wilder Schools whole-school assembly Mini BioBlitz in school grounds

Day 2: Project planning and research

Developing outline projects with specific actions for school grounds

Day 3: School grounds project development

Building support within the school community and with stakeholders Develop fundraising ideas

Term 2 – Making Space for Nature

Day 4: Raising awareness

Whole school assembly: members of year group present project ideas and promote fundraising event

Fundraising event


Promoting community action day

Day 5

Day 7: Identification and monitoring skills

Developing further understanding of species
and learning monitoring skills and techniques.

Day 8: Monitoring and learning in the school grounds

Team taught sessions on invertebrates or plants

Day 9: Celebration assembly

Team taught sessions Evaluation and exit interview

Additional day: Suffolk Wildlife Trust led visit to a nature reserve to improve species identification skills.



Year 2 – Join Wilder Schools network to access free training and webinars

Termly meetings to support school staff in setting and meeting outdoor learning targets

Year 3 – Review

Termly meetings to review outdoor learning and gains for nature Sharing success with other schools
