Volunteer manager tasks include leading on volunteer recruitment, onboarding, recognition and day-to-day management of volunteers.

ROLE PURPOSE

Suffolk Wildlife Trust is an inspiring and impactful organisation with a compelling vision for our county: A Wilder Suffolk where nature is thriving and abundant because everyone is doing more to help

In the decade to 2030, we are committed to scaling up our activities across the county, to bring nature back to Suffolk. Our aim is for 30% of our county to be connected and well looked after for nature by 2030, so that our species and habitats can recover and thrive – and for 1 in 4 people to be actively helping to achieve this.

Working within the Farm Wildlife Advice Team, and as part of the wider Wilder Landscapes Team, the post holder will support the delivery of wildlife advice and habitat improvement across Suffolk's farmers and landowners, helping the Trust achieve its vision for a Wilder Suffolk and strategic goals of 30% of our county to be connected and well looked after for nature by 2030.

You will work closely with the Farm Wildlife Advisers and under the direction of the Wilder Landscapes Advice Manager to help maintain and strengthen networks within the farming and land management community. Through this, you will support the development of landscape-scale projects that deliver tangible benefits for priority species and habitats across Suffolk's farmed landscapes.

You will assist the with day-to-day advisory work, helping to provide practical support to farmers and landowners to create and enhance habitats and to manage land in ways that benefit both wildlife and sustainable farming.

MAIN RESPONSIBILITIES

Every staff role has three key areas of focus known as the "Power of 3" to support our mission to bring nature back. Typically, you should expect to spend 80% of your time on these:

1) Assist Farm Advice Team to provide expert wildlife advice to Farmers and Land Managers

- Utilise your skills and experience to assist with the delivery of wildlife advice to farmers in Suffolk.
- Assist with farmers and landowners to inspire them to take action to help Suffolk's wildlife either
 through existing or recommended management or via wilding approaches. With support from the
 Farm Advice Team provide informal habitat management advice through site visits, reports,
 signposting.
- Assist with supporting farmer and landowner clusters.

- Develop expertise in specialist areas of farming, farm wildlife as part of your professional development, to benefit your work and strengthen the team overall.
- Report successes internally to colleagues.

2) Assist Farm Advice Team with delivery of funded projects on habitat enhancement and creation that deliver strategic objectives.

- Including agri-environment schemes, other government grants, and private investment opportunities.
- Delivering investment in biodiversity on farmland to support our priority species and habitats, at the direction of the Wilder Landscapes Advice Manager, alongside Farm Wildlife Advisers.
- Assist Farm Advisers in developing and delivering agri-environment scheme advice, including supporting scoping, application development and delivery under supervision.

3) Expand influence on wildlife friendly farming to a wider audience of landowners, farmers stakeholders and public across Suffolk

- Assist with organisation and delivery of Farm Wildlife Advice team events for farmers and landowners, to widen our audience across Suffolk farmers and landowners and build our position as leading experts in the county.
- Assist with reporting successes externally to the wider public through events, articles, social media and meetings
- Represent the Trust at external stakeholder meetings.
- Be an ambassador for Suffolk Wildlife Trust.
